## Czech history and legends in comic strip


This exhibit presents some of the outstanding characters of Czech history, as well as the heroes of a number of Czech legends. The authors of these comic strips are students in Illustration for Media Communication and Education from the Institute of Art and Design of the University of Western Bohemia. The young artists have illustrated the lives of persons who had a significant influence on the history of their country and whose names have become bywords for social, cultural or technical progress in their day. So people of various professions from yesteryear are right next to others from more recent times: Václav Havel (playwright and politician), Bedřich Smetana (composer), Josef Čapek (writer), Johann Amos Comenius (« Teacher of the nations », educationist and philosopher), František Křižík (inventer) and many more. We want to pay hommage to them by means of this exhibit and the album to be published on this occasion, and to present their life stories to the Belgian public.



The collection is further enlivened by a selection of Czech legends. Both the exhibit and comic strip art benefit from the gracious support of the town of Pilsen, candidate for the European Capital of Culture for 2015, and the Region of Pilsen.
